



REFLECTION OF 2022

he year 2022 will be remembered in the history of Willowridge high school as the year of transition, empowerment and dynamism. The Principal of the school Mrs Gisela Pretorius resigned from her post barely 8 months into her tenure of office to pursue her career dreams overseas. This left a huge vacuum in the school management team. The remaining staff members hastily put together a crack team led by the Deputy Principal Mrs Chriselda Saayman in order to continue operations as well as to avert a disaster. This proved to be a viable solution as the new management hit the ground running and continued with the day to day management of the school.

All major projects and operations that had been initiated at the appointment of Mrs Pretorius were expeditiously and successfully executed. These included the repainting of the school's wide perimeter palisade fence as well as the major repairs of the school's irrigation system which had been dysfunctional over a long time due to ageing. Extensive infrastructural repairs and maintenance were undertaken for the first time since the establishment of the school in 1987. More staff members were afforded the opportunity to actively play a role in the day to

thereby according them a practical feel of school leadership in different capacities. The primary focus was to make Willowridge high school the best English medium high school in Pretoria through academic excellence as well as making inroads in marketing the school through different social media platforms. Group cohesion was fostered through social functions in the school with the pinnacle being the Wolfpack party which was hosted during the evening and was a huge success. The school management team feels that more can be gained through such functions in the future. Despite the dampened spirits triggered by Mrs Pretorius departure, the

Willows wolfpack reconvened, put heads together and rebranded themselves to emerge as the true victors of the year 2022. This can aptly be summed up through King Solomon's words (Proverbs 27:17). King Solomon asserts that "As Iron sharpens Iron so one person sharpens another". As the school leadership at Willowridge high school were caught in a crisis, they had to rally and work as a collective, sharpening each other's minds in the process. They had to help each other to grow and be in tune to the crisis that was going on around them. And yes, they even helped each other to professionally grow and move in the right direction, to stay on track, to walk

away from dejection and

Open day was a huge success. Every parent and potential future learner learnt something new about the environment an thoroughly enjoyed the activities presented.


The club members had a wonderful Saturday morning picnic after walking the scenic route to the top of the Faerie Glen Nature Reserve mountain.

It may not get easier but you will be happy.


Of that I am sure.
